MESSAGES FROM THE STREETS Four Bay Area artists attribute different significance to living environments that move them to creation. Staming from a Victorian house, a pler, or the East Bay, they utilize found objects, pier hardware. San Francisco signs, or snapshot fragments, and then progress to treat them in varying ways from the very unorthodox, thought-provoking. and socially relevant to the beautifully abstract and touching.

Thousands of madonnas and babes, but what does the male MEN AND CHILDREN artist feel about children? Four male artists exhibit work that reflects their attitudes toward children, whether their own or others. We see the psychological depths of children in a printmaking medium; the family unit in photorealist painting; the artist's interpretation of his own children in oil; and the interaction of a child's creativity with photography.

An exhibition of 20th-century artists for whom CALIFORNIA WOMEN ARTISTS insufficient information exists in books or in California archives. Researched throughout 1980, the findings will be available in written form to complement the exhibition of works by these remarkable and influential women. NERS A

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
