Foothill trustees honor Dr. Flint at gala dinner

An "instant tradition" was born in Palo Alto around a convivial table of 24 diners.

The place was Rickeys Hyatt House, where original and current trustees of the Foothill Community College District honored retiring Superintendent Calvin C. Flint and Mrs. Flint.

Participants including cur-

rent and past district trustees and original district administrators, plus spouses, applauded an early-evening inspiration of Mary (Mrs. Louis S.) Levin's: that the "oldtimers" get-together be made an annual event.

Chief motivator of the nohost, cocktail and dinner party Thursday evening was U.S. District Judge Robert F. Peckham, assisted by Mrs. Levine and A. P. "Pete" Christiansen, all retired members of the first permanent board of trustees elected in May, 1957.

The proposed yearly reunion will be possible because the Flints will retain their Los Altos home despite plans for world travel after he leaves his 13-year post on June 30. August's end will see their departure for a five-week tour of England, Ireland and Scotland. Their tentative travel plans for the ensuing year embrace Hawaii, Mexico, and Japan.

For Thursday night's closeknit group it could have been an emotion-filled occasion, except that Cal Flint quickly set the bantering mood.
