From April 6 to 22, the Euphrat Museum of Art will observe Earth Day 1993 with the exhibition *Reconstructing Nature*. Because caring for the earth is the responsibility of people of all ages, the exhibition presents works by children as well as by adult art-world artists Mineko Grimmer and Francisco Perez.

Mineko Grimmer, based in Los Angeles, is represented by a piece from her *North American Woods Series*. Beautifully crafted in wood, metal, pebbles, and ice, Grimmer's "sound-producing kinetic sculpture" makes music of sorts as the ice melts, releasing pebbles to ricochet through boxes strung with bamboo and wires. This haunting work is informed by a reverence for nature.

Sculptor Francisco Perez, who lives and works in San Francisco, uses recyled materials and found objects in his pieces about the relationship between the social world and the natural world, a relationship which tends to be distorted in urban areas. *Reconstructing Nature* includes four altar-like sculptures which comment on what Perez terms "a society drunk on uncontrollable consumption."

Also included in Reconstructing Nature are a rainforest-inspired installation and mural, collaborative

works by children of the Cupertino Union, Los Altos, and Sunnyvale School Districts. The Euphrat's Arts & Schools Program coordinated the project, with the participation of classroom teachers from Bishop, Collins, Columbia, de Vargas, Faria, Fremont-Older, Garden Gate, Lincoln, McAuliffe, Monteclaire, Nimitz, Oak, Santa Rita, and Stocklmeir elementary schools.

The public is invited to a festive opening reception on Saturday, April 10, noon to 2 pm, at the Euphrat Museum of Art. The reception will feature hands-on activities including papermaking with recycled and natural materials, trees of life/árboles de la vida, found object sculptures, and a chalk-in. The Singing Children and Children's Philharmonic Ensemble, both from Sunnyvale's The Music School, will provide entertainment. Refreshments will be served. The reception and activities are free-of-charge.

Parking is available at the Flint Center Garage (eight quarters) or on Mary Avenue across Stevens Creek Boulevard from De Anza College.
