## 175 records arrive for KFJC college radio

One hundred and seventy five records arrived last week for radio station KFJC, Foothill College Radio.

The majority of the selections are classical, although some light and airy tunes are included.

A large selection of jazz records arrived in an earlier shipment. Included in the previous shipment were several mood and hi-fi records.

The educational FM station will have a total of 365 records this year. To date, 275 have arrived. Of the 365, about 225 will be classical, 75 jazz, 40 mood, 10 sound effect and 15 educational lectures.
